

ATTENTION ELIZABETH WATER CUSTOMERS

Beginning in April 2021, the Village will be completing a water system improvements project entailing the replacement of two existing undersized water mains, with roughly 1,700 LF of new 8” water main along Catlin Street. Along with the replacement of roughly 500 LF of 8” water main along Locust Street. The total project is estimated to cost \$1,198,400.00 and is being financed with 25-year 1% loan from the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency’s Public Water Supply Loan Program (PWSLP). The Village will also be securing \$400,000 in principal loan forgiveness from IEPA. The final loan amount the Village will have to pay back is estimated at \$798,400.00.

The Public Water State Revolving Fund (SRF) is administered by the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency (IEPA). A portion of the IEPA money to fund these types of projects comes from the US Environmental Protection Agency. SRF programs operate in each state to provide communities with the resources to build, maintain and improve the infrastructure that protects one of our most valuable resources: water.

The project will provide improved water service and water quality to the Village’s water distribution system, along with improved fire flow.
