

CHAPTER 3

PARADES

SECTION:

8-3-1: Permit Required

8-3-2: Conditions of Permit Issuance

8-3-1: **PERMIT REQUIRED:** No person, association, firm, corporation, or other entity, public or private, shall organize, conduct, direct, control, supervise, establish, or lead any parade within the corporate limits of the Village, unless there shall have first been granted the permit from the Village therefor. For the purposes of this Chapter, a parade permit shall be required by any group of three (3) or more persons, animals, or things who or which intend to walk, ride, traverse, travel, or be carried, led, or driven in and about the public rights of way of the Village for a common purpose, as depicted and described by signs, posters, place cards, or signboards carried with or worn by them, which said common purpose shall be any purpose not illegal or obscene. (1979 Code § 9-1, 9-3; amd. 2002 Code)

8-3-2: **CONDITIONS OF PERMIT ISSURANCE:** No permit hereunder shall issue except upon the following terms: (1979 Code § 9-2)

- A. Application for Permit: A written application therefore shall be submitted to the Village Clerk on a form provided by him, signed by the parade sponsor or a responsible officer thereof, not less than fourteen (14) days prior to the parade, indicating the purpose and the desired route. (1979 Code § 9-2-1)
- B. Permit Fee; Exemptions: A fee of one-hundred dollars (\$100.00) shall be paid with such application; provided however, those applications in behalf of charitable, educational, or religious organizations or associations, community fairs or agricultural expositions, and veterans' organizations shall be exempted from the payment of such fee. (1979 Code § 9-2-2)

C. Routing Requirements:

1. U.S. 20 Routing: No parade shall be conducted upon or across Main Street, Diagonal Street, or Madison Street (U.S. Highway 20) unless and until there is submitted along with said application the written consent of the State or its appropriate department or agency thereto.
(1979 Code § 9-2-3)
2. School or Church Routing: No parade shall be conducted upon a route within five-hundred feet (500') of any school during the school term unless the school superintendent has consented thereto, nor with five-hundred feet (500') of any house of worship during the hours of service therein unless the appropriate official has consented thereto, which consents shall be submitted along with said application.
(1979 Code § 9-2-4, amd. 2002 Code)
3. Routing on Public Ways: Parade routing shall be confined to the public rights of way within the corporate limits of the Village and shall not enter upon a private property or any private or public building.
(1979 Code § 9-2-5)
